DOES YOUR CHILD TELL YOU THAT THEY KNEW THE MATERIAL BUT DID POORLY ON THE EXAM? If this happens regularly, they could suffer from EXAM ANXIETY!

Many of our students experience severe anxiety in the days leading up to and while writing exams; this anxiety usually amplifies even further for final exams.



What does exam anxiety feel like for students?

Exam stress is different for everyone and shows up in different ways:

- In their bodies: fast heartbeat, clammy hands, tense muscles, headaches, trouble sleeping, stomach problems (such as nausea, diarrhea, not feeling hungry)
- ☐ In their mind: trouble concentrating or remembering, racing thoughts, mind going blank
- ☐ In their feelings: feeling moody, scared, or overwhelmed
- ☐ In their actions: fidgeting, nail biting, using more substances (such as tobacco, alcohol, or others), losing touch with friends, not doing activities they like


